# Reduce-Re-use-Recycle

---

The City of Douglasville has designated November 15<sup>th</sup> – 18<sup>th</sup> as “Re-cycles Week”. They have scheduled an electronics drop off event from 9:00 AM thru 1:00 PM Saturday November 13th in the parking lot of First Presbyterian Church at 9190 Campbellton St. (across from Freedom Island). Bring all your old or unwanted electronics to be recycled. If it plugs in or takes batteries, you can recycle it. There is a \$5 charge for computer monitors, \$10 charge for TVs under 50 lbs and \$20 for rear projection TVs and large TVs with wooden cabinets.

Also, if you are not already taking advantage of the city's curbside recycling program here is some information about recycling that you may not know...but should!

## Recycling costs nothing and may even save you money!

Many people have found that they can switch from the large trash cart (90 gallon cart for \$19.50 per month) to the small cart (\$16.50 per month and save \$ 3.00 per month by recycling.

If you or your spouse is over 64 and use the smaller cart you may be able save an additional \$13.50 /month through the city's special program for senior adults.

## Recycling is easy!

The city of Douglasville is working hard to reduce the amount of material that ends up in their land fill and makes it very easy for you to recycle.

The city provides as many “blue boxes” as you need at no cost.

All you need to do is put your recyclable materials in the blue box and set it at the curb on the same day you put out trash (Wednesday morning in Rosewood).

The City uses a “co-mingled” re-cycling program. All recyclables can be put into a single box. There is no need to sort your recyclable materials

Many materials are recyclable. This includes almost all plastics (even plastic grocery bags), paper, cardboard, aluminum, tin cans.

## Recycling helps our environment!

Reduces use of limited natural resources . . . trees, petroleum, metals, etc

Prevents some indestructible materials from getting into our land fill

saves energy

Safeguards our environment for future generations

## Your participation is important!

Recycling is part of the overall solution to reducing waste, and we can all help by participating in our community's recycling program.
